

The Bexley (Bexley Prescribed Routes)(No. 4)
Traffic Order 2004

Made 20th September 29004

Coming into operation on 23rd September 2004

The Council of the London Borough of Bexley, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 , of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act, 1985(b) and of all other powers thereunto enabling hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 23rd September 2004 and may be cited as The Bexley (Bexley Prescribed Routes)(No. 4) Traffic Order 2004.
2. No Person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in either direction in Bexley Lane, Sidcup between a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 93 and 95 Bexley Lane and a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 113 and 115 Bexley Lane to turn so as to face the opposite direction to that in which it was proceeding.
3. Nothing in this Order shall apply to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (b) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in any length of road in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
